#### **ACTIVITIES REPORT FOR THE YEARS 2019-2022**

#### Introduction

Sukriti Social Foundation is a Chennai based cross disability organisation working since 2006. Our main focus areas are Prevention, Rehabilitation, Training, Empowerment and Advocacy.

**Prevention**: As a prevention of disability initiative, we are providing orthopaedic appliances to children with limb deformities. We reach out to the needy children through our community outreach programs. We are also partnering with the Government Hospitals in this initiative. Our main such outreach program is at the Government Institute for Child Health where we have been working since 2014.

**Rehabilitation:** For adults with disability, their mobility is very important. We provide calipers, wheelchairs, walkers etc to adults so that they can carry on their life with less dependence on others.

**Training:** We provide skill training to persons with disability. Our most successful program is training in cycle servicing and assembling. Our training partner is TI Cycles of India.


**Empowerment:** It is very important to earn a livelihood to live with dignity. We help in setting up micro enterprises like cycle repair shops, tailoring centre for persons with disabilities

**Advocacy:** Advocacy helps in getting support from others and to stand up for your own rights. We do on line campaigns, signing online petitions and participating in public events

## Distribution of orthopaedic appliances to children

The major portion of the year was good till the pandemic broke in late March. Our clinic at the Institute saw a steady inflow of children. We reached out to 496 children with 706 appliances.

Micro enterprises: We gave 5 sewing machines to start their own tailoring unit


**International day of persons with disabilities:** Every year we observe the International Day of Persons with disabilities on 3<sup>rd</sup> December. It's an event where we invite all our beneficiaries to a day of caring, sharing and rejoicing. Around 200 children from residential care homes along with our own beneficiaries participated. There was an entertainment for children followed by a meeting which was presided over by Mr Prasad Yadav, Secretary of Maharashtra Bhavan. Mobility aids and sewing machines were distributed to needy persons.

## 2020-21

It was the first year of the pandemic. The first few months were very unsettling not knowing what to do. For children with disabilities, if the orthopaedic appliances are not replaced then the deformity will relapse. Slowly we got our act together. Children with club foot needed our attention. During the year we reached out 408 children out which 250 were children with club foot.



**Marriage of disabled**: We supported the marriage of one visually impaired couple in the mass marriage conducted by Lions Clubs International


**COVID Relief**: Parents of children whom we are supporting were in distress. We reached out to 30 families with cash transfer.

# 2021-22

It was one of the worst years that humanity had ever seen. With the second COVID wave, the heavy loss of lives left all of us speechless. As things started easing out a bit we saw a sudden spurt in the number of children coming to us for appliance. Raw materials and labour force was in short supply. However we managed to reach out to 629 children with 901 appliances.



COVID Relief: Covid relief to 20 persons were given by direct cash transfer

Wheelchair for persons with intellectually disability: Due to COVID, all the special schools had closed down. Children with intellectual disability were getting very restless staying inside the four walls of their house. So we provided wheelchairs to 10 such persons living in Kanyakumari.
